

PATIENT LIAISON GROUP

"POOL" APPOINTMENT SYSTEM

To increase the availability of GP appointments on a daily basis, once all pre-bookable appointments have been taken, a new "Pool" system has been introduced. Patients are offered an appointment, in half hour blocks, between 10.30 and 12.30, where they are invited to attend the surgery and sit and wait for the next available GP. This system has been trialled during the past few weeks and has been very successful in meeting the high demand for GP appointments and will now be maintained as demand necessitates. It must be stressed however that this is not a "drop-in" facility. Patients must first

book an appointment in the usual way. You might like to know that, at present, the Practice has just over 8000 patients, and currently nearly 600 patients attend the surgery every week!

FRIENDS AND FAMILY SURVEY

All practices now have to submit a monthly report to NHS England of their "Friends and Family" responses. Subsequently, these monthly figures will now be regularly published in this newsletter for your information. Last month patients responses to "would you recommend our Practice" were as follows: Extremely likely/Likely - 89%; Extremely unlikely/Unlikely - 5%;

Unsure/Don't know - 6%.

Disappointingly - a slight increase as 39 patients did not attend their doctors appointment and 61 did not attend their nurses appointment! So that's still 100 patients wasting valuable appointments and time! So please don't get complacent, remember -

AGE UK THANET _ HELPING TO BEAT SOCIAL ISOLATION

At Age UK Thanet we are mindful that there are many very lonely older people within the Thanet area. Every effort is made to reach these people and to help them. However not everyone is able or well enough to come to our centre and or our events. So we offer a meal delivery service, known as bloomers buddy box meals, for those who would struggle to cook for themselves. We deliver lunches and afternoon teas; we can even provide a companion to eat lunch or tea with. For many eating alone can be rather depressing and lonely, so we can provide a volunteer to dine with.

Helping to make meal times sociable and enjoyable times again.

Our support at home service runs a befriending scheme, which involves volunteers regularly visiting an older person on a regular weekly or fortnightly basis offering conversation and companionship. A short visit can make a huge difference to an older person's quality of life, providing something to look forward to and an opportunity to make a new friend. Child Sexual Exploitation – silence is

never an option

A multi-agency team funded by the Kent Police and Crime Commissioner, Ann Barnes, that was set up to tackle child sexual exploitation (CSE) has had a very successful first three months.

The Kent and Medway Child Sexual

Exploitation team, set up in December 2015, brings together the police, Kent County Council, Medway Council and health services to target offenders and identify and help young people at risk.

Since then they have had over 300 calls

- resulting in more than 600 pieces of intelligence. A total of 19 offenders have been arrested since the end of December, meaning a number of children in the county have been safeguarded. Protecting vulnerable children from sexual exploitation is a key priority in

the Commissioner's Police and Crime Plan, and last year she pledged to give £600,000 over three years to help the force deliver on this priority; which has been used to set up the multi-agency team.

Speaking on Child Sexual Exploitation Awareness Day on 18 March, Mrs Barnes said: "Child sexual exploitation is happening in Britain, including right here in Kent. It is not new, but for too long it went unchallenged. I recognised the need for a more joined-up approach to tackling child sexual exploitation and protecting the most vulnerable of children, which is exactly why I found the money so our vital multi-agency team much success they've had in just three months – it just goes to show what can be achieved when partner agencies work together. I hope everyone will take the opportunity to familiarise themselves with the signs to look out for in young people; such as unexplained gifts or cash, drug or alcohol use, missing school and running away. Silence is not an option – it is never an option – but only by acknowledging the risks can we all work together to prevent abuse." Anyone with any information, or who

BEACON LIGHTING COMMEMORATING THE QUEEN'S 90TH BIRTHDAY

Jubilees, Weddings, Coronations and Special Birthdays with the lighting of beacons - on top of mountains, churches and castle battlements, on town and village greens, farms, country parks and estates, and along the beaches surrounding our shores. The last major beacon celebration was on Her Majesty The Queen's Diamond Jubilee on 4th June 2012, which many took part in.
